SERMON TOPIC FOR SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 9 A Seat at the King's Table

Scripture Reading: 2 Samuel 9:1-13

OUT OF THE PULPIT From Pastor Jim Coston

A few weeks ago, I mentioned in a previous column that I've felt and functioned as an *interim pastor* for most of this year. The word *interim* means "for a limited time" or "temporary." An interim pastor, then, is a temporary shepherd who serves a congregation between permanent pastors. That may sound odd, considering I've served here for more than nine years. Allow me to explain.

Earlier in the spring, as First Baptist engaged in some honest soul-searching about our future, I sensed God preparing the church for a new beginning. And I also sensed that this new beginning might not include me. If First Baptist were to become a campus church, I wouldn't be here. If we decided to keep running the same plays from the same playbook (to borrow a sports analogy), then it seemed clear that we might need someone else to run those plays—someone other than me.

At that point, I expected to step away from the Lead Pastor role by May. As a methodical planner, I hadn't scheduled any sermon series beyond April—something unusual for me since I usually plan a year ahead.

When the Elders decided to move forward as we are—though with renewed energy from the congregation—I was both thankful and surprised to remain as Lead Pastor. Yet that *interim feeling* didn't go away. After much prayer and conversation with trusted colleagues, I realized that feeling was from God. It wasn't about circumstances at First Baptist; it was about what God was doing in me.

I experienced something similar back in 2009, when God called me from First Baptist Trenton to Calvary Baptist in Waco. It was humbling to recognize that FBCT needed a new voice besides mine. But they did—and God provided for them, for Calvary, and for me.

What I learned then still holds true today: sometimes God makes it clear that a church needs a new voice, a different set of gifts. I believe that's where First Baptist is now. The Search Committee, with your input, is prayerfully identifying those qualities and strengths. God will guide both the church and the next pastor together in His perfect timing.

Because God has led First Baptist into a season of transition, I see myself as serving in an interim capacity. My role now is to maintain stability and momentum—to help First Baptist continue moving forward, welcoming new

people, prioritizing Sunday worship, and supporting our Staff. The difference is that I'm not making long-term decisions beyond next spring.

All of this has unfolded apart from my marriage. I sensed God calling me *from* this role before He called me *to* the next—something my marriage has now confirmed.

Please pray for First Baptist, for our Staff, and for the Search Committee—Angela, Carol, Gayle, John, Paul, Quintin, and Shawn—by name. Pray for me during this transition season. And most of all, pray for the person God is already preparing to become the next pastor of First Baptist. Ask God how He wants to use you in this time to make disciples and advance His kingdom.

A MONTH IN THE LIFE OF FIRST BAPTIST SCOTTSDALE From Gary Tannenbaum

God is good! It's amazing how many positive things can happen in the life of a church in just 6 months. In the last 6 months, First Baptist has experienced a resurgence of optimism about the future direction of the church.

Here is a list of some of what has happened over the last 6 months.

- The Elder Board approved a FBCScottsdale 5-year Revitalization Plan.
- The lot across the street was sold and we subsequently had a burning of the mortgage celebration.
- Members donated money for much needed new microphones for the sanctuary sound system.
- MomCo added as a ministry that provides community support for families and their young children.
- For Easter, 50 children, grades1-5, joined us for an egg hunt and had a great time. We were able to meet members of our community that came to the event.
- The church office is now open 10am-3pm, Monday-Thursday, and is staffed by dedicated volunteers.
- After a valley wide search, the church selected Steve Culp as its new Worship Leader. Steve is
 regularly assisted by his wife Jamy. They both have a love for the Lord and our church, and enjoy
 sharing their musical talents to lift up our Lord and our spirits.
- The congregation voted in 3 new Elders:
 - Moderator (Shawn Crosier)
 - Treasurer (Paul Malin)
 - Creative Arts (James Olsen).
 - Also, the Building and Grounds Elder (Craig Hazeltine) was voted in by the board to finish the term of an Elder who moved away.
- We saw a revival of the MasterPeace Theater with the production of "New Frontiers" by young people from our church and our community. Rehearsals are in progress for a December 13th and 14th production of "A Charlie Brown Christmas".
- Continuing Conversations began, with activities featuring ice cream and potlucks after service.
- New co-leaders have continued our strong greeter ministry on Sunday mornings. We have seen many new volunteers greeting those who enter and leave church on Sundays. Training sessions have been ongoing.
- Children's Choir and other children's activities on Wednesday nights are ongoing.
- We are leasing out space on campus to assist the City of Scottsdale's growth as well as help the church financially.
- The Fall Family Fest was a big success with over 400 members of our community joining the fun. We
 were honored to have the band Snake Eyes play for the event. Over 70 volunteers helped make
 memories of God's love for the families.
- The people of our church stepped up beyond their normal giving to improve the beauty and usability of the spaces between the buildings by funding the installation of artificial turf.

All this being said, our Lord does not want us to be complacent about our church community. He asked that we, above all, love one another and be part of a caring community of his followers. If you study the lifelines of churches, groups, and individuals, you see events take place that create alliteratively a resurgence, revival,

renaissance, rebirth, rebound, and in the case of our Lord, a resurrection. This is happening here, and there is always an open invitation to become part of the storied and continuing history of First Baptist Scottsdale. Opportunities abound. We are blessed to have so many dedicated volunteers who feel blessed to support the church and each other, and there is always room for more.


PRAISE THE LORD!


CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER UPDATE From Shawn Crosier, Elder Board Moderator

NEW PRAYER ROOM IS OPENING








Beginning **Sunday, November 9, 2025**, this space will become a **Prayer Room** designed for individuals or small groups of **1–6 people**.



We are very concerned, not only for families we know, but about so many others in our community. According to federal data, almost 500,000 people receive SNAP benefits in Maricopa County alone, and these benefits have now been suspended due to the government shutdown. Recently, Chaneni House has been seeing 35 to 40 clients on each day we are open, and we can only expect that number to rise. If you can help, we would appreciate any donations, especially for the family food bags.

You may drop off donations at Chaneni House between 9 and 12 on Monday, Wednesday, Friday, or First Saturday, or in the wagon in the church lobby on Sunday morning. Designated monetary offerings may, of course, be made through the church.

- Boxed Cereal

CONTEXTUAL NOTES FOR THIS WEEK'S READINGS

Titus

Written by Paul to Titus, a Gentile convert and trusted coworker, serving on the island of Crete to instruct Titus on how to organize and lead the church in Crete, emphasizing sound doctrine, good works, and godly leadership.

Philemon

Written by Paul to Philemon, a Christian in Colossae, and his household. This is A personal letter appealing for forgiveness and reconciliation with Onesimus, a runaway slave who had become a Christian under Paul's ministry

Themes: Christian forgiveness and reconciliation; equality in Christ transcends social status and, the power of the gospel to transform relationships.

Hebrews

Author unknown, though traditionally attributed to Paul. Written to Jewish Christians tempted to revert to Judaism due to persecution. The purpose of the letter is to show that Christ is superior to all aspects of the Old Covenant — the Law, priesthood, and sacrifices — and to encourage perseverance in faith.

Themes: Jesus Christ is supreme — the final revelation of God; the New Covenant fulfills and surpasses the Old; faith, endurance, and maturity are essential in the Christian life.



Let's participate in some Creation-care by beautifying our stretch of Osborn Road. We may meet some neighbors and make new friends!


