### OUT OF THE PULPIT From Pastor Jim Coston

For years, First Baptist has been blessed by our faithful Greeters—those friendly folks who open the doors to the Worship Building, offer a warm hello, and help point the way to the Sanctuary. But as important as that welcome is, we're expanding the mission.

Last week, I met with our Greeters for a time of training and vision casting. We talked about moving beyond just opening doors. We're equipping our Greeters to engage more meaningfully with visitors and new guests—asking simple but thoughtful questions like, *"What brings you here today?"* or *"Where are you from?"* Our hope is to help new faces feel noticed, known, and gently connected into the life of our church.

### But here's the exciting part: YOU'RE GOING TO BE PART OF THIS TOO!

Going forward, we'll still have Door Openers. But the rest of the Greeter team will take on a new role—as **Guides**. Their job? To spot visitors, start a friendly conversation, and then—here's the key—**connect that guest to someone like you**.

Let's say a Guide meets a new guest from Chicago. That Guide might know the Bretzes or Gary Tannenbaum also hail from the Windy City. So, the Guide will walk the guest over, make the introduction—*"You're both from Chicago!"*—and a real, natural conversation begins.

In the coming Sundays, don't be surprised if a Guide taps you on the shoulder and says, *"Hey, I'd like you to meet someone."* We're asking you to take it from there. Be yourself. Make the guest feel welcome. And most importantly—invite them to sit with you in Worship.

That simple act of hospitality can transform a one-time visit into the beginning of a spiritual journey. It may just enrich your Sunday experience too. The Greeter ministry involves EVERYONE!

## SIX-MONTH NEW TESTAMENT READING PLAN



We've begun a six-month New Testament reading plan! Below is a suggested schedule for you. We will publish several days of readings each week as a guide to help you keep on track.

#### Some background on Matthew:

The Gospel of Matthew is attributed to **Matthew the tax collector**, one of Jesus' twelve disciples. The writer was deeply familiar with **Jewish scripture and tradition**, and wrote primarily for a **Jewish-Christian audience**.

The purpose of Matthew's Gospel is to **present Jesus as the long-awaited Jewish Messiah**, fulfilling Old Testament prophecies, and to show how the Kingdom of Heaven is breaking into the world through Him.

### Big themes from Matthew 5 – 20

#### 1. The Kingdom of Heaven

- Jesus proclaims and demonstrates the arrival of God's kingdom—not a political reign, but God's rule over hearts and lives.
- Seen in **parables** (Matt. 13), **miracles**, and **teachings** that reveal the nature of the kingdom: unexpected, gracious, and upside-down compared to worldly systems.

#### 2. Righteousness from the Heart

- In the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5–7), Jesus deepens the Law to address the heart, not just actions.
- True righteousness includes humility, mercy, purity, and peace.
- It's not about external religion, but inward transformation (e.g., anger, lust, revenge, love of enemies).

### 3. Jesus' Authority

- Jesus displays authority over sickness, demons, nature, sin, and even death (Matt. 8–9).
- He also claims the authority to interpret the Law, forgive sins, and demand absolute allegiance (Matt. 10, 16).
- His identity as Messiah and Son of God is gradually revealed and affirmed (esp. in Matt. 16:16–17:5).

### 4. Discipleship and the Cost of Following Jesus

- Jesus calls people to **follow Him** with full devotion, leaving behind security, relationships, and pride (Matt. 10, 19).
- Disciples are to embody servanthood, forgiveness, and childlike humility (Matt. 18–20).
- **Suffering** is part of the call (Matt. 10:16–39; 16:24).

### 5. Opposition and Misunderstanding

- Religious leaders (Pharisees, scribes) frequently oppose Jesus, challenging His authority and miracles (Matt. 9, 12, 15).
- Even John the Baptist questions Jesus, and the disciples struggle to fully understand His mission (Matt. 11, 16–17).
- Jesus predicts His rejection, suffering, and death multiple times (Matt. 16:21; 17:22; 20:17).

### 6. Reversal of Expectations

- Jesus consistently upends cultural and religious assumptions:
  - **Blessed are the poor**, not the powerful (Matt. 5).
  - The last will be first (Matt. 19–20).

- **Children**, women, Gentiles, and sinners are welcomed.
- Parables like the Workers in the Vineyard (Matt. 20) highlight God's gracious generosity, not human merit.

### 7. Mercy, Compassion, and Healing

- Jesus embodies God's **compassion** through frequent **healings**, care for the **marginalized**, and **mercy** toward sinners (Matt. 8–9, 14–15).
- His actions fulfill Isaiah's prophecies and reveal the character of the kingdom: restoration and wholeness.
